ADMISSIONS PROCESS:

We want to get to know you! Please complete the Application, the References sheet, the Required Essays, and Fee Waiver Application (if applicable) **legibly in ink**. **You can also request a link to complete online, if you prefer.**

2. When we receive your complete application, we will contact you and your family to talk with you about the program and your interest and to answer any questions you may have.
3. The Admissions Committee will call your references and review your application. Feel free to contact our office for more information.

PROGRAM FORMS: Once we approve your application, we will send you additional program forms, including the standard agreement/social contract, and medical questionnaire. To hold your place in the program, you and your family must return these by the deadlines shown on the forms.

PROGRAM FEE and FEE WAIVERS: The program fee pays for room, board, activities, staffing, and workshop materials. Personal expenses and travel are *not* included. **Full or partial fee waivers** are based on family need as assessed from the **Fee Waiver Application**. Accepted applicants will work with Encampment staff to raise a portion of their fee.

Program Fee is \$3500.

**Full and partial fee waivers are available.
No one will be turned away due to lack of funds.**

Fee Waivers:

Anyone who requests financial assistance must complete the **Fee Waiver Application** and send it along with the application materials. All information will be kept confidential.

Your participation is important! If you want to make a difference in your community, we encourage you to apply. We will make every effort to enable you to attend regardless of your family's financial situation. Full or partial fee waivers can include aid for program fee, as well as sponsorship support for personal expenses and transportation.

ACCEPTANCE DEPOSIT and PROGRAM FEE PAYMENT: When we accept you for the summer program, we will need a deposit to hold your space. This will be applied toward your program fee. A payment schedule will be arranged; all payments must be received before June 1 unless otherwise arranged.
